#### **COMMENTS FROM THE CHAIR**

President Dan Brin mentioned that the agenda item regarding the Circle S ranch is off the agenda as it has become a dead issue and agenda item 15-030 as well is being pulled from the agenda due to late developments. The subject of agenda item 15-030 will be on the agenda of the Tuesday night Zoning and Planning meeting next week. On Monday morning, the Glenn V. Smith in West Hills Helispot was dedicated, the the culmination of years of work. Plaques are mounted at the helispot honoring the late LAFD pilot Glenn V. Smith.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

CD 12 Deputy Field Representative Ron Rubine talked about the Chatsworth Ecology Pond and the complex dynamic there. CD12 is looking into long-term solutions and cares about the issue. Dan Brin will be speaking at Lazy J Ranch Park on Aug. 7 during the dedication of new playground equipment there. A Coyote Town Hall is coming up on Aug. 16 at Mason Park. The Restricted Overnight Parking signs that were requested are in the works, they are approved and they are just waiting to be installed. The reopening of the Haynes Street Bridge is working its

way through the process; there have been orders to comply. The city's law to make the possession of ammunition magazines 10 rounds or over is in the works as well. "Conversations with Councils" is coming up on Sept. 9 at the San Fernando Valley Mission to discuss the issue of homelessness in the valley. Mr. Rubine thanked the WHNC for co-sponsoring CD12's Movie under the Stars event at Shadow Ranch Park, even if it was rained out.

Law Enforcement: West Hills North has a new Senior Lead Officer (SLO), Sean Brown. He will be at the September Board Meeting. SLO Janet Zumstein (West Hills South) announced the Golf Tournament coming up that supports local children. She is requesting that the council sponsor a "tee sign." Individual golf play is \$150. Event is Oct. 26, 2015. She is looking for sponsors.

Lastly, the current quarterly Neighborhood Watch newsletter has a lot of tips on avoiding a home burglary. Her goal is to have one month with ZERO crime.

Recently elected School Board Member Scott Schmerelson said his office is staffed every day and is located in Granada Hills in the Birmingham High School complex. Community Impact Statement West Hills Neighborhood Council Council File 15-0843 Allow Pets in Rental Units

More than 2 million L.A. residents (approximately 62%) are tenants and estimates are that more than half the housing stock consists of rental units that do not accept companion animals. Such non-acceptance of companion pets are cause for eviction, moving to new housing and the relinquishing of much loved pets to animal shelters. As a result, many animals are euthanized and pet owners are devasted by their loss. West Hills Neighborhood Council supports motion 15-0843 as made by Paul Koretz and seconded by Mitch O'Farrell that the Los Angeles Department of Animal Services (LAAS) and the Housing and Community Investment Department (HCID) solicit input from organizations representing tenants (such as the Coalition for Economic Survival, Inner City Law Center, Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles, Housing Rights Center and BetTzekek Legal Services) and organizations representing landlords (such as the Apartment Association of Greater Los Angeles and the California Apartment Association) and make recommendations within 180 days to the City Council on programs and/or regulations that could facilitate the expansion of animal adoptions by tenants in residential rental properties, including programs to better inform tenants of their rights in regards to animal ownership, while taking into consideration the welfare of the animals and the concerns, both financial and for the physical property, that landlords and other tenants may have; and they further move that applicable laws in other cities be reviewed to determine if their provisions should be considered as a basis for developing regulations or incentives for the City of Los Angeles.

There is growing consensus around the value of parcel-based stormwater management, a "watershed approach" that synergistically treats each site as a mini-watershed where water is Captured, Conserved, and Reused, as follows:

- Capturing at least the first 1" of rainwater with rain tanks, permeable surfaces, and grading strategies like bioswales, berms and basins to help manage stormwater onsite, improve water quality, reduce local flooding, and recharge local groundwater.
- Conserving outdoor water use by installing landscaping with at least 60% SoCal native, climate-appropriate plants and trees that support wildlife habitat and preserve our region's biodiversity, and with the use of mulch and organic ground covers that mitigate heat island impacts, build healthy soils, and help sequester carbon.
- Minimize use of water and utilize more water reuse to help maintain our urban forest and support landscape and ecosystem needs without additional potable supplies.

West Hills Neighborhood Council supports the motion made by Paul Koretz and Paul Krekorian and seconded by Jose Huizar that the Department of Water and Power and the Bureau of Sanitation, and with the consultation of stakeholders, be requested/directed to evaluate and present the City Council within 60 days options to incentivize applicants to meet this multi-benefit "watershed approach." Such options should include tiered rebate levels, on-bill financing, and measures to ensure fair geographic and economic distribution of rebate funds. Additionally, the options should describe their potential to accelerate or diminish expected water savings from turf removals and encourage direct groundwater recharge and infiltration where applicable. The Department of Water and Power and the Bureau of Sanitation shall be directed to report back to City Council in 60 days on potential funding sources to help incentivize residents to adopt the "watershed approach."






PROPOSED ELEVATIONS. LOT # 1

OPOSED ROOF AND FLOOR PLAN. LOT # 1









WHEREAS West Hills became a distinct, officially recognized neighborhood of the City of Los Angeles in 1987; and

WHEREAS West Hills has since made good progress toward solifying its identity as a proud community with an active and concerned populace; and

WHEREAS much of West Hills is situated within the 91304 ZIP code, which is served by a post office on Canoga Avenue in nearby Canoga Park; and

WHEREAS computer programs used by the United States Postal Service automatically assign addresses in the 91304 ZIP code as being in Canoga Park; and

WHEREAS merchants, the Global Positioning Service, government agencies, major web sites and many other businesses and agencies rely on Postal Service data to determine the political jurisdictions serving homes and businesses within ZIP codes; and

WHEREAS as a result of current practices by the Postal Service, residents and businesses within West Hills are regularly misidentified in letters, government documents and digital maps as being residents of Canoga Park; and

WHEREAS the West Hills Neighborhood Council exists in part to foster pride and a strong sense of identity for it stakeholders; and

WHEREAS the West Hills Neighborhood Council does NOT in any way intend disrespect toward the neighborhood, people and institutions of Canoga Park, but only wants due respect for West Hills' own identity; and

WHEREAS the United States Postal Service already automatically assigns 4 additional digits to the ZIP codes of addresses to identify letter carrier routes, and these digits are called "ZIP+4" numbers; and

WHEREAS these numbers delineate areas smaller than ZIP codes and can be adapted fairly easily to political boundaries such as those that delineate West Hills; and

WHEREAS United States Representative Brad Sherman has agreed to investigate and promote the updating of USPS algorithms to assign addresses within appropriate ZIP+4 carrier routes to West Hills;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the West Hills Neighborhood Council endorses such efforts to update practices by the United States Postal Service to recognize all addresses within West Hills as being in West Hills.
