President Char Rothstein called the meeting to order at 7:07 PM.

Secretary Brad Vanderhoof called roll and a quorum was established.

Vice President Faye Barta led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The January Meeting minutes were approved.

Senior Lead Officer (SLO) Report:

SLO Dinse gave the report. The Police Commission has scheduled hearings regarding selecting the new LAPD Chief of Police. Public comment is encouraged. Grateful Hearts event is April 6 at Warner Center Park. Coffee with a Cop will be held February 13 at Roscoe and De Soto, and February 14 at Ventura and Shoup. The City Attorney's office no longer has neighborhood prosecutors assigned to the LAPD Divisions. There was a street takeover for street racing two Sundays ago. A vacant house covered in gang graffiti at 22626 Roscoe was demolished by LAFD. There is another house in the area with eviction in progress. There was an attempted sexual battery at the Victory trailhead and the suspect was arrested.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Carolyn Greenwood gave the report based on the December Monthly Expense Reports (MER). Net available balance was \$22,990.37 at the end of December. There is still an outstanding check to Hamlin Elementary.

Controller's Report: Controller Saif Mogri gave the report. December expenses were Apple One, Rackspace, The Web Corner, and \$6.08 for copies for the January Board meeting. The report matches the City Clerk website.

Comments from the Co-Chair(s): President Rothstein talked about the Senior Valentine's Day Dance. Saif Mogri said there are currently 119 registered guests.

Induction new board member into the WHNC Board of Directors:

Alejandro Phillips was inducted and took the NC oath.

Announcements:

Assembly District 46, Mr. Jack Trent-Dorfman, Field Director introduced a new field rep. who will cover Woodland Hills to Van Nuys. The annual Day of Service will be April 14 at Pierce College. Assemblymember Gabriel will chair the Budget Committee this year.

Council District 12, Mr. Colin Crews, District Director said CD12 is still working to get cameras installed at Shadow Ranch Park. Councilmember Lee's motion to install Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR) was approved. There is now some limited funding for resurfacing alleys.

Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE): The NEA was not present, but President Rothstein made an announcement; The Civic Leadership team is preparing for the month of March to celebrate Women's History Month. Save the Date! On March 28, 2024, the Department will be hosting a Women's Leadership Event at City Hall at the Tom Bradley Center.

Supervisorial District 3, Ms. Sophia Soudani, Field Representative said it is estimated 3.6 gallons of rainwater fell on LA County during the recent storms. A small landlord relief fund has been created and \$46 million allocated. Supervisor Horvath is now Chair of the Board of Supervisors and also chairs LASHA.

Budget Advocates, Mr. Glenn Bailey said the monthly report was sent out Monday and a primary topic is the city employee vacancy rate. There is a proposal to prioritize hiring for critical positions. The related council file is CF 23-1422. Saturday, June 15 is Budget Day at City Hall. The Budget Advocates are planning a town hall on the DONE proposed budget.

Public Comment:

Jeff Sacher asked for all meetings be provided with a virtual access for stakeholders and all meetings be recorded and posted.

Paula Miller talked about Hands on Remodeling and Keller Williams.

Glenn Bailey said the VANC presentation tonight concerned success protecting single family homes and a proposed ordinance to increase allowable noise and dust from construction sites. Next month the Sepulveda Basin plan will be discussed.

Myrl Schreibman said the Operations Committee should discuss new member participation on committees and dissemination of information to stakeholders
