Please describe the purpose and intent of the grant:

Welby Way Elementary School and POWW are applying for a multiple series speaker performance on topics such as; Kindness, Character development, growth mindset, anti-bullying campaigns, critical thinking development and tools for success and positive mindset. These presentations utilize game, songs and live role play examples with the students. This format will help to integrate the topics deeper into the child's brain and impact behaviors on students, in families when brought home for discussion and interactions with the direct community members in which they are in contact with. Due to the large population of students, these performances would need to be conducted 3 times within each day in order to accommodate everyone. By combining several academic disciplines in this approach, we hope to find a more effective solution to the current problems faced in the aftermath of our social climate.

How will this grant be used to primarily support or serve a public purpose and benefit the public-at-large.

Welby Way Elementary School has a charter and Magnet program. Our school consists of almost 800 students who come from both the local West Hills community but also have the pleasure of enriching members of other parts of the valley. During the Covid lockdowns, our students were deprived of some of the fundamental core years of developing, practicing and reinforcing some key social and emotional skills. Many of these students were left to navigate zoom learning on their own while their parents worked, were socially isolated from peers, had experienced new added stressors and/or grief in their home. The impact of this is now being seen in a regression of behaviors at home, school and in the community at large. As a school we are committed to re-plant those seeds firmly and nurture them to develop stronger roots, in the present but as they also transition into middle school and high school years. The investment of time, energy and money in this area is priceless and will ripple beyond just our Elementary school but to the community and beyond.
