The City of Los Angeles is in the process of updating Community Plans that affect land use and could result in potentially widespread changes to single-family zones allowing multi-story developments. The CHIP (Citywide Housing Incentive Program) Ordinance as originally written would amend Los Angeles Municipal Codes by streamlining project review procedures and give special incentives to builders disrupting communities' zoning protections and involvement.

On November 19th the City Council PLUM Committee (Planning and Land Use Management) met and voted unanimously to protect single-family zones in support of amended **CHIP Ordinance- Draft #3 without Exhibit D options.** Special thanks to our 12th District Councilmember John Lee, Chair of the PLUM Committee, and the entire PLUM Committee for their support and "Yes" votes.
