The West Hills Neighborhood Council is your local voice in city government.

The West Hills Neighborhood Council is YOU — everyone who lives in West Hills, works in West Hills, owns property in West Hills or has an ongoing stake in the welfare of West Hills.

Our Neighborhood Council is served by 25 board members who are chosen by the community in elections run by the City of Los Angeles. This board of unpaid volunteers listens to — and encourages participation by — stakeholders as it represents West Hills on matters concerning all levels of government.


Here's some of what we do:

- We work closely with our City Council representative and staff to deliver the best possible city services to the people and places that need them.
- We help our stakeholders resolve problems by connecting them with the right people in government.

- We organize community festivals, community forums, a Halloween house decoration contest,, a seniors' dinner dance, health & safety fairs and more.
- We organize monthly cleanups and develop other projects for volunteers to get involved in improving their community.
- We educate the community on matters of public safety and emergency preparedness. We work with the police to spread awareness of crime trends and ways to defend ourselves against crime.

The boundaries of West Hills:

A. North – From the center of the intersection of Topanga Canyon Boulevard and Nordhoff Street going west along the centerline of Nordhoff Street to its end, and continuing that line westward to the Los Angeles city limits;

- **B. East** From the center of the intersection of Nordhoff Street and Topanga Canyon Boulevard going south along the centerline of Topanga Canyon Boulevard to the center of the intersection of Topanga Canyon Boulevard and Roscoe Boulevard, then west along the centerline of Roscoe Boulevard to the center of the intersection of Roscoe Boulevard and Shoup Avenue, then south along the centerline of Shoup Avenue to the center of the intersection of Shoup Avenue and Victory Boulevard;
- **C. South** From the center of the intersection of Victory Boulevard and Shoup Avenue going west along the centerline of Victory Boulevard to the city limits;
- **D. West** From the intersection of the centerline of Victory Boulevard and the city's western limits going north along the city limits to the northern boundary of West Hills.

This election will fill 13 of the 25 seats on the West Hills Neighborhood Council Board of Directors.




After signing in, you will be asked questions about your status as a stakeholder. You also will be asked to upload provide the image of a valid driver's license or other proof of stakeholder status.

You may vote if you live, work or own real property in West Hills or if you have an ongoing interest in West Hills, such as belonging to organization in the community.

The minimum voting age is 16. Non-citizens may vote regardless of status as long as they meet the above criteria as stakeholders over the age of 16.

NOTE: Documentation that you are eligible to vote in this West Hills election is required for registration. Accepted documents can include a driver's license, utility bill or membership roster of a West Hills organization.
